COVID-19 SPECIAL NOTICE (12)

Dear Home owners,

We are now on day 29 and have indeed hit the home straight towards the end of the current Lockdown at 23:00 on 30 April 2020. Thank you once again for complying with the Regulations which are in place to protect us all, and we request that all still abide with them as this is a crucial moment in our struggle against the coronavirus.

The President announced yesterday evening that the national coronavirus alert level will be lowered from level 5 to level 4 with effect from Friday the 1st of May, based on the below Risk alert/level diagram. A copy of his full speech is attached for ease of reference.



Risk-adjusted strategy for economic activity

An alert system with levels of restriction

Ongoing feedback loop informs decision to remain at a particular level, relax restrictions further, or return to a higher level of restriction.

Level 1	Low virus spread, high health system readiness
Level 2	Moderate virus spread, with high readiness
Level 3	Moderate virus spread, with moderate readiness
Level 4	Moderate to high virus spread, with low to moderate readiness
Level 5	High virus spread, and/or low readiness

Our understanding is that the information set out below is broadly going to be the basis but more detail, for example on “some activity will be allowed to resume subject to extreme precautions to limit community transmission and outbreaks” will only be confirmed next week when new Regulations are gazetted.
