COVID-19 SPECIAL NOTICE (11)

Dear Home owners,

We are now on day 22 and hopefully have hit the home straight to the end of the current Lockdown. Thank you once again for complying to the Regulations which are in place to protect us all.

A further Amendment to the Regulations of the Disaster Management Act has been announced and was published yesterday. A complete copy is attached for ease of reference.

Two particular changes in this document which are of direct relevance are:

1. The definition of Lockdown is extended to 23:59 on 30 April 2020, and
2. Trades necessary for the rendering of emergency repair work, including plumbers, electricians, locksmiths, glaziers and roof repair work are now included in the list of essential services.

Keeping in mind that we are all focused on limiting the spread of the Covid-19 Virus, the following procedure needs to be followed in the event that you require emergency repair work:

- Contact the relevant service provider and make arrangements as per normal for access control (Advise Control room of details).
- The Service provider will be requested to complete a register(name, contact details, reason for visit) on arrival at the control room. Should any uncertainty arise, the control room will contact the Estate manager for assistance.
- The Service provider will be required to present a valid Essential Services Certificate or Permit which will be copied for our records. If it appears that the Certificate /Permit is obviously invalid, access will be denied and the service provider will be referred to SAPS in Kleinmond to obtain a valid Permit.

We have been approached to allow access to cleaning and swimming pool services, but these are not deemed as essential or emergency services and access to such service providers shall be denied.

SAPS has confirmed that our interpretation of the rules is correct.
